## Shaping NAMI VC 2023 And Beyond

As 2023 is nearing its end, I have some exciting news, a serious request, and immense gratitude for all those who continue to contribute to making NAMI Ventura County an exceptional organization.

Let's start with the serious request first.

As you may be aware, our NAMIWalks event is the largest annual fundraiser. This single event largely supports our free programs year-round. This year, our Board of Directors set a fundraising goal of \$200,000. The lingering effects of the COVID-19 pandemic continue to impact our organization, with sluggish donations, increased operating costs, and a growing demand for classes, support groups, and workshops aimed at combating stigma.

Although we held our NAMIWalks event on Saturday, October 7th, we still have until the end of this year to continue raising funds. We encourage you to keep NAMI Ventura County in mind as you prepare for Giving Tuesday and your end-of-year charitable donations. You can still contribute to NAMIWalks by visiting www.namiwalks. org/venturacounty.

In the win column, NAMI Ventura County has been awarded an innovation grant from the NAMI national organization to create a new program. This program, tentatively titled "Workplace Wellness," will be developed at NAMI Ventura County by our own Kimberly Quinn. Quinn, the driving force and author behind our Community Cares Workshop, is building this program to include five independent modules specifically for employers to offer to their



employees to address and improve mental health.

The \$100,000 Innovation Grant was part of the generous donations made to NAMI by philanthropist MacKenzie Scott. Look for the Workplace Wellness program to launch in late Spring 2024.

And finally, I want to express my heartfelt gratitude. NAMI Ventura County is a special organization doing exceptional work, and that wouldn't be possible without our amazing volunteers. From teachers and presenters to administrative assistants and special event volunteers, the people who stand with NAMI Ventura County are truly some of the best. Thank you for your continued dedication to mental health education, support, and advocacy.

# **Cultivating Mental Health at Work Unveiling New Innovations For Wellness**

NAMI Ventura County is thrilled to share some exciting news. Our organization has been awarded a generous Innovation grant of \$100,000 from the NAMI national organization to develop a cutting-edge mental health program, tentatively named Workplace Wellness. In a world where the well-being of employees is paramount, this program aims to revolutionize how we approach mental health in the workplace.

Just a handful of California NAMI affiliates received funding from this grant initiative, made possible from a generous bequest by philanthropist Mackenzie Scott.

#### Program Overview:

Workplace Wellness is an ambitious initiative that encompasses five comprehensive modules. Each module addresses a specific aspect of mental health, promoting education, awareness, and empowerment among employees. Employers will have the opportunity to mix and match modules according to the needs of their workforce.

1. Recognizing & Preventing Burnout: Stress and burnout are pervasive in the

modern workplace. This module will provide employees with tools and strategies to recognize and combat burnout. By developing resilience and effective coping mechanisms, employees will be better equipped to handle the pressures of their roles.

- 2. Self-Care Strategies: Self-care is often neglected in the hustle and bustle of work life. This module will teach employees the importance of self-care and equip them with practical methods to incorporate it into their daily routines. Encouraging employees to prioritize self-care not only benefits their mental health but also enhances their overall performance.
- 3. Destigmatizing Mental Health: Mental health stigma is a significant barrier to seeking help. Our program will focus on eradicating workplace stigma and fostering a culture of openness and support. We want every employee to feel safe discussing their mental health concerns without fear of judgment.
- 4. Effective Communication Tools: Healthy communication is at the core of a positive work environment. This module will teach

Like others in the nonprofit sector, NAMI Ventura County has experienced distinct challenges directly related to the Covid-19 pandemic. Donations have declined. There is more competition for grants than ever before. And Mental Health Services Act funding is spread thin due to increased need. Those challenges have resulted in a budget shortfall.

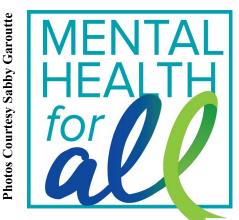
NAMI Ventura County is a fighter. We are immediately taking steps to cut costs, increase grant funding, and have undertaken an ambitious goal for NAMIWalks 2023. To cut operating costs, our offices moved to Community Conscience in Thousand Oaks in September. This generous community organization will save NAMI VC more than \$36,000 per year in rent and utilities. NAMI Ventura County has also welcomed a dedicated grant writer onto the staff. This individual has already shown unique promise and dedication to pursuing new grant funding for NAMI VC.

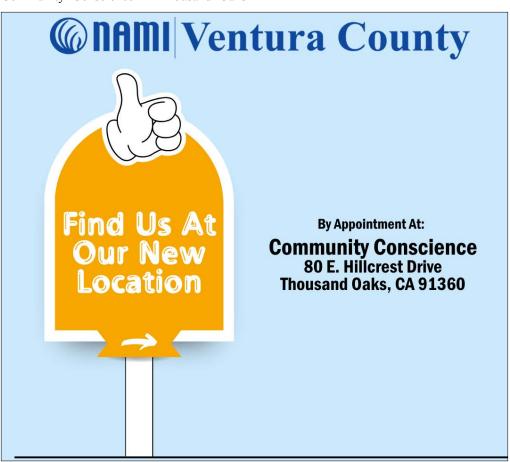

#### **FAMILY PROGRAMS**

#### FAMILY TO FAMILY CLASS

An 8-week education course for families. partners and friends of individuals living with a mental health condition taught by trained family members. En español como: Familia a Familia.

#### FAMILY SUPPORT GROUPS

These groups are for families, partners and friends individuals living with a mental health condition, including parents, siblings, spouses, partners or friends. En español como: Grupo de Apoyo.

#### PEER PROGRAMS

#### PEER TO PEER CLASS

An 8-week education class for adults living with mental illness who are looking to better understand their condition and journey toward recovery. Taught by a trained team of peers living in recovery with mental health conditions.

#### **NAMI CONNECTION**

A twice-monthly recovery support group for people living with mental illness where people learn from each other's experiences, share coping strategies, and offer encouragement and understanding.

#### ANNUAL EVENTS

#### NAMIWALKS 2023

Every journey begins with that first step! Through NAMIWalks' public, active display of support for people affected by mental illness, we are changing communities and ensuring that help and hope are available for those in need.

#### HEART TO HOME HOLIDAY SERIES

A festive and popular NAMI Ventura County tradition expanding in 2023 to three events. For each event, individuals living in board and care facilities receive fun and festive treats. The winter celebration includes a curated party along with with a delicious dinner and gift bag. #### STIGMA BUSTING PROGRAMS

#### COMMUNITY CARES WORKSHOP

A unique public education program developed by NAMI, where two speakers share compelling personal stories about living with mental illness and achieving recovery. #### ENDING THE SILENCE FOR STUDENTS

ETS for Students is designed for 7th through 12th grade audiences.

#### ENDING THE SILENCE FOR SCHOOL STAFF

A 90-minute presentation designed to inform educators and school administrators about student mental health. This presentation includes information about warning signs, facts and statistics, how to approach students and how to work with families. It includes a storytelling segment from a lived-experience speaker.

#### ENDING THE SILENCE FOR FAMILIES

This 90-minute presentation is designed specifically for parents or guardians of middle or high school aged youth. The presentation includes warning signs, facts and statistics, how to talk with your child and how to work with school staff. It includes a storytelling segment from a lived-experience speaker.

#### NAMI ON CAMPUS

When students connect with one another, they can share common experiences and support each other. NAMI on Campus helps make those connections happen. NAMI on Campus clubs work to end the stigma that makes it hard for students to talk about mental health and get the help they need. Clubs plan innovative awareness events in partnership with NAMI Ventura County.
